### WARNING

- Do not use this TV near water.

- Protect the power cord from being walked on or pinched, particularly at plugs, and the point where it exits from the TV.

## Electrical information

### Mains supply

The mains operating voltage is detailed on the rating plate on the rear of the TV.

## Instruction

This equipment has been designed and manufactured to meet international safety standards but, like any electrical equipment, care must be taken if you are to obtain the best results and safety is to be assured.

DO read the operating instructions before you attempt to use the equipment.

DO ensure that all electrical connections (including the mains plug, extension leads and interconnections between the pieces of equipment) are properly made and in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions. Switch off and withdraw the mains plug before making or changing connections.

DO consult your dealer if you are ever in doubt about the installation, operation or safety of your equipment.

DO route the mains lead so that it is not likely to be walked on, crushed, chafed, or subject to excessive wear and tear or heat. DON'T remove any fixed cover as this may expose dangerous voltages.

DON'T obstruct the ventilation openings of the equipment with items such as newspaper, tablecloths, curtains, etc. Overheating will cause damage and shorten the life of the equipment.

DON'T allow electrical equipment to be exposed to dripping or splashing, or objects filled with liquids.



## **Battery safety guidelines**

Take care to fit your batteries correctly, observing the plus and minus marks on the battery and appliance. Incorrect fitting can cause leakage or, in extreme case, fire or even an explosion.



Replace the whole set of batteries at one time, taking care not to mix old and new batteries or different types, since this can result in leakage or, in extreme cases, fire or even an explosion.




Supervise children if they are replacing batteries themselves in order to ensure these guidelines are followed.



Store unused batteries in their packaging and away from metal objects which may cause a short-circuit resulting in leakage or, in extreme cases, fire or even an explosion.



Remove dead batteries from the unit and all batteries from the unit you know you are not going to use for a long time. Otherwise the batteries may leak and cause damage.



Make sure battery compartments are secure.



Never dispose of batteries in fire as this can cause them to explode. Please recycle dead batteries; do not put with the normal household waste.



Never attempt to recharge ordinary batteries, either in a charger or by applying heat to them. They may leak, cause fire or even explode. There are special rechargeable batteries which are clearly marked as such.

## Safety warnings

### Use in a vehicle

#### Note

For use only when vehicle is Stationary.

- Read all the instructions carefully before using the unit and keep them for future reference.
- Retain the manual. If you pass the unit onto a third party make sure to include this manual. Check that the voltage marked on the rating label matches your mains voltage.

### Damage

- Inspect the unit for damage after unpacking.
- Do not continue to operate the unit if you are in any doubt about it working normally, or if it is damaged in any way -switch off, withdraw the mains plug and consult your dealer.

### Location of Unit

- The unit must be placed on a flat stable surface and should not be subjected to vibrations.
- Do not place the unit on sloped or unstable surfaces as the unit may fall off or tip over.
- The mains socket must be located near the unit and should be easily accessible.

### Temperature

- Avoid extreme degrees of temperature, either hot or cold. Place the unit well away from heat sources, such as radiators or gas/electric fires.
- Avoid exposure to direct sunlight and other sources of heat.

### Naked Flames

• Never place any type of candle or naked flame on the top of or near the unit.

#### Moisture

- To reduce the risk of fire, electric shock or product damage, do not expose this unit to rain, moisture, dripping or splashing. No objects filled with liquids, should be placed on the unit.
- If you spill any liquid into the unit, it can cause serious damages. Switch it off at the mains immediately. Withdraw the mains plug and consult your dealer.

#### Batteries

- Batteries used in the remote control for this unit are easily swallowed by young children and this is dangerous.
- Keep loose batteries away from young children and make sure that the battery holder tray is secure in the remote control. Seek medical advice if you believe a cell has been swallowed.
- Dispose of batteries correctly by following the guidance in this manual.

#### Supervision

- Children should be supervised to ensure that they do not play with the unit and the remote control.
- Never let anyone especially children push anything into the holes, slots or any other openings in the case -this could result in a fatal electric shock.

#### Service

- To reduce the risk of electric shock, do not remove screws. The unit does not contain any user-serviceable parts. Leave all maintenance work to qualified personnel.
- Do not open any fixed covers as this may expose dangerous voltages.

#### Maintenance

- Ensure the unit is fully unplugged from the power supply before cleaning.
- Do not use any type of abrasive pad or abrasive cleaning solutions as these may damage the unit's surface.
- Do not use liquids to clean the unit.

The power cord on this equipment is supplied with a moulded plug incorporating a fuse. Should the fuse need to be replaced, an ASTA or BSI approved BS1362 fuse must be used of the same rating. Never use the plug with the fuse cover removed. If a replacement fuse cover is required, ensure it is of the same colour as that visible on the pin face of the plug. If there is no alternative to cutting off the mains plug, dispose of it immediately, having first removed the fuse, to avoid a possible shock hazard by inadvertent connection to the mains supply.











Standard 100mm × 100mm VESA mount using M4×10mm size screws.





## Remote control

## Remote control

### Installing the batteries

- 1. The battery compartment cover is on the back of the remote control. Slide the cover to open it.
- 2. Install the two AAA size batteries following the polarity markings inside the compartment.
- 3. Replace the battery compartment cover.



### Using the remote control

To use the remote control point it at the TV and press the required buttons. You must be within 6 metres and at an angle of less than 30 degrees from the centre of the TV.

**Note:** Sunshine or other strong light sources may interfere with the signal from the remote control. In this situation, turn the TV set away from the light source.



Warning! Do not leave batteries in the remote control for extended periods as they can leak or corrode causing damage to the remote control. Check them periodically and replace them as required.



Warning! Do not mix battery types. When inserting batteries, replace all batteries at the same time. Do not mix old and new batteries.



Warning! Exhausted batteries must be treated with care and disposed of according to any safety or recycling regulations in force in your local area. Never dispose of batteries into general waste, or fire.

### Connecting the aerial



Warning! Make sure the TV and all ancillary equipment are unplugged from the mains before making any connections

Place the TV on a stable flat surface, which is out of direct sunlight and away from any heat sources. In order to prevent TV picture distortion, make sure you avoid close proximity to other electrical devices such as microwave ovens.

Connect the aerial cable to the back(RF in) of theTV. Connect satellite cable to the SAT socket on the rear of theTV.

To connect it directly through a recording device (DVD recorder), connect the TV/DVD as shown below. For best results use a high gain TV aerial, preferably roof or loft mounted.

If in a poor signal area, to improve picture quality, purchase and install a signal amplifier (not supplied).

### Connecting external devices


The Quick Start guide shows the simplest and most effective way of connecting to external devices. These and alternate methods are listed below.

### HDMI lead


You can connect the TV to a compatible device using a HDMI lead, using this method will give you optimum picture.

Connect the cable from the HDMI equipment to one of the TV HDMI sockets.

The HDMI1 will support the ARC function, so it is possible to connect the TV to an audio device that also has ARC capabilities. Please activate this function in the TV MENU by setting the CEC and ARC settings to ON, allowing the standard supplied TV remote control to control the audio device volume and standby conditions.



#### Select the wanted SOURCE, select "Antenna" for DVBT scan



### Switching on

## Note: Unless otherwise stated, all references to buttons refer to the remote control.

I Press the **power** switch on the left hand side of the TV 2. Press the **Standby** button on the remote control. The standby indicator will change to blue.

### Switching off

To switch the TV to standby press the **Standby** button on the remote control. The standby indicator will change to red.

To save energy do not leave the TV in standby mode for long periods such as overnight. Switch the TV off using the **Power** switch on the side of the TV

### Tuning in digital TV


When the TV is switched on for the first time the following screen will appear, press the  $\checkmark$  buttons to select the wanted country.

At first installation to download the default list please Select "Channel" and press OK when Auto tuning is highlighted



A new display will be presented Please ensure scan mode is set to Preset and press OK



Any new/wanted channels can now be edited/sorted to the users desired preferance, please refer to page 20 for channel edit feature.

### Frequently Asked Questions

### For satellite setup

I) No channels found, signal and quality bars are zero?

Please check satellite dish/LNB setup, also all cables are in position correctly Confirm there is a clear line of sight to where the dish is pointing with no obstructions, i.e. trees, buildings etc. Ensure your location is within the footprint of the desired satellite transponder.

2)Full scan performed but limited or incorrect channels are received? Ensure the dish is aligned with selected satellite correctly, e.g.. Astra 28.2

3)Picture or sound is breaking up or dropping out whilst viewing?

Confirm signal quality, enter Channel Search menu and check strength and quality bars. A slight missalignment could cause a large reduction in signal strength.Also confirm cable quality for satellite reception and cable length. A long cable run could incur significant signal loss (this can be copensated with a signal amplifier/booster). Ensure dish is correct size to receive wanted signal.

4)Loss of signal in light rain or snow Usually due to signal strength, please confirm all items above

5)Loss of signal in windy conditions Confirm all dish and mountings are secure and are not moving in the wind. Check there are no obstacles such as trees moving back and forth in front of dish.

6)Subtitles or audio language are incorrect Confirm preferred settings in language settings


7) How do I add additional channels not in original line up?

You will need to add additional transponder, please follow detailed instruction in the manual.

### Basic operation

### Source selection

Press the **Source** button to display the source menu. The following sources are available:



Use the  $\blacktriangle \checkmark$  buttons to scroll between inputs and press OK to select the source.

If no source is manually selected using the **OK** button, the TV will automatically switch to the highlighted input after 2 seconds.

Press the **Exit** button to exit the display.

### TV channel selection

Press the  $CH^/CH^{\sim}$  buttons or use the Numeric buttons on the remote control to select a channel you require.

### Return

Press the  $\bigcirc$  button to swap between the channel you are watching and the previously selected channel i.e.If you were watching channel I and change to channel 3, press the  $\bigcirc$  button to return to channel I.

Press the  $\bigcirc$  button again to return to channel 3.

### Volume

Press the V+/V- buttons to increase or decrease the volume. The volume level will be displayed at the bottom of the screen.

#### Mute

Press the  $\overleftarrow{M}$  button to mute the sound.Mute will appear at the top left hand side of the screen.

Press the  $\bowtie$  button again or the V+ button to restore the sound. Mute will disappear from the screen.

### Favourite(Digital TV only)

You can enter the Favourite menu while watching a channel by pressing the **Fav** button. The following menu will appear on the screen:



To add a channel to the Favourite List, press the **MENU** button and scroll down to the Channel Setup.Press the  $\blacktriangleright$  button to access the menu.Press the  $\checkmark$  button to select Programme Edit then press **OK**.

In the Programme Edit menu is a list of all available channels. Select the channel that you want to add to the Favourite List. Press the **Fav** button to add the selected channel. A heart will appear next to the selected channel.Press the Exit button to exit the menu.

### Subtitle

If a channel has subtitles available, you can select the subtitles by pressing the **Subt** button.Select the required language using the  $\blacktriangle \forall$  buttons then press **OK**.


### Menus

**Sharpness** - Allows you to increase or decrease the sharpness of the picture.

**Tint** - Allows you to increase or decrease the level of tint of the picture (only NTSC signal)

**Colour Temperature** - Allows you to change the colour tones of the screen. You can choose from the following settings:

Aspect Ratio - Allows you to set up aspect ratio.

**Noise Reduction** - Allows you to reduce/alter any noise on the images.

Dynamic CR - Turn dynamic contrast ratio on/off.

**HDMI Mode** - Allows you to set HDMI settings Auto/Video/PC.

**Sound Mode** - Allows you to select preset levels of bass and treble. You can choose from the following settings:

**Balance** - Adjust audio output between the left speaker and the right speaker with  $\blacktriangleleft \triangleright$ .

Auto Volume - Allows you to turn auto volume on or off. Surround Sound - Allows you to turn on surround sound. SPDIF Mode - Choose between Off/Auto/PCM when connected to non Dolby compatible device.

**AD Switch Mode** - Choose between narrator mode and auto mode.(only availabe in DTV).

**AD Switch** - When AD switch is set to narrator mode, it allows you to choose on or off.

**AD Volume** -When AD switch is set to on, it allows you to adjust AD volume with ◀ ► .

Headphone - Allows yo to turn on/off the headphone output.

### Channel Setup(Digital TV only)

This menu allows you to adjust the channels and the channel settings.

**Auto Tuning** - Allows you to automatically search for channels.

**DVB-T Manual Search** - Allows you to manually search and tune the TV.

**Programme Edit** - Allows you to delete, skip and add channels. to the Favourite list.

**Signal Information** - Allows you to see channel information, signal strength and signal quality.



## USB operation

Most flash memory, USB HDD etc. belongs to Mass Storage Class. Mass Storage Class includes 2 transport manners:

I. USB 2.0 Mass Storage Class Control/Bulk/Interrupt (CBI) Transport

2. USB 2.0 Mass Storage Class Bulk-Only Transport

This unit supports USB 2.0 Mass Storage Class Bulk- Only Transport.

When using USB I.I Mass Storage Class Bulk-Only Transport devices, please note that the file operation




