Safety information

WARNING

- Do not use this TV near water.
- Do not install or operate near any heat sources such as radiators, stoves, or other apparatus that produce heat.

- Install in accordance with the supplied Quick start guide and this User guide.
- Protect the power cord from being walked on or pinched, particularly at plugs, and the point where it exits from the TV.

- Unplug this TV during lightning storms or when unused for long periods of time.
- To avoid interference, switch this TV off while operating other radio devices in the immediate vicinity.
- Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel. Servicing is required when the TV has been damaged in any way.

- No naked flame sources such as candles should be placed on the TV.

Electrical information

Mains supply

The mains operating voltage is detailed on the rating plate on the rear of the TV.

Instruction

This equipment has been designed and manufactured to meet international safety standards but, like any electrical equipment, care must be taken if you are to obtain the best results and safety is to be assured.

DO read the operating instructions before you attempt to use the equipment.

DO ensure that all electrical connections (including the mains plug, extension leads and interconnections between the pieces of equipment) are properly made and in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions. Switch off and withdraw the mains plug before making or changing connections.

DO consult your dealer if you are ever in doubt about the installation, operation or safety of your equipment.

DO route the mains lead so that it is not likely to be walked on, crushed, chafed, or subject to excessive wear and tear or heat.

DON'T remove any fixed cover as this may expose dangerous voltages.

DON'T obstruct the ventilation openings of the equipment with items such as newspaper, tablecloths, curtains, etc. Overheating will cause damage and shorten the life of the equipment.

DON'T allow electrical equipment to be exposed to dripping or splashing, or objects filled with liquids.

DON'T place hot object or naked flame sources such as lighted candles or night-lights on, or close to equipment. High temperatures can melt plastic and lead to fires.

DON'T use makeshift stands and NEVER fix legs with wood screws-to ensure complete safety always fit the manufacturer's approved stand or legs with the fixings provided according to the instructions.

DON'T use equipment so that you are distracted from the requirements of traffic safety.

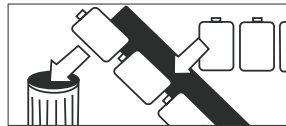

Battery safety guidelines

Used correctly, domestic batteries are a safe and dependable source of portable power. Problems can occur if they are misused or abused- resulting in leakage or, in extreme cases, fire or explosion. Here are some simple guidelines to safe battery use designed to eliminate any such problems.



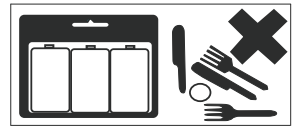
Take care to fit your batteries correctly, observing the plus and minus marks on the battery and appliance. Incorrect fitting can cause leakage or, in extreme case, fire or even an explosion.



Replace the whole set of batteries at one time, taking care not to mix old and new batteries or different types, since this can result in leakage or, in extreme cases, fire or even an explosion.



Supervise children if they are replacing batteries themselves in order to ensure these guidelines are followed.



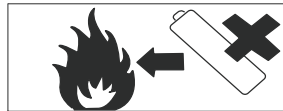
Store unused batteries in their packaging and away from metal objects which may cause a short-circuit resulting in leakage or, in extreme cases, fire or even an explosion.



Remove dead batteries from the unit and all batteries from the unit you know you are not going to use for a long time. Otherwise the batteries may leak and cause damage.



Make sure battery compartments are secure.



Never dispose of batteries in fire as this can cause them to explode. Please recycle dead batteries; do not put with the normal household waste.



Never attempt to recharge ordinary batteries, either in a charger or by applying heat to them. They may leak, cause fire or even explode. There are special rechargeable batteries which are clearly marked as such.

Safety warnings

Use in a vehicle

Note

For use only when vehicle is Stationary.

- Read all the instructions carefully before using the unit and keep them for future reference.
- Retain the manual. If you pass the unit onto a third party make sure to include this manual.
- Check that the voltage marked on the rating label matches your mains voltage.

Damage

- Inspect the unit for damage after unpacking.
- Do not continue to operate the unit if you are in any doubt about it working normally, or if it is damaged in any way -switch off, withdraw the mains plug and consult your dealer.

Location of Unit

- The unit must be placed on a flat stable surface and should not be subjected to vibrations.
- Do not place the unit on sloped or unstable surfaces as the unit may fall off or tip over.
- The mains socket must be located near the unit and should be easily accessible.

Temperature

- Avoid extreme degrees of temperature, either hot or cold. Place the unit well away from heat sources, such as radiators or gas/electric fires.
- Avoid exposure to direct sunlight and other sources of heat.

Naked Flames

- Never place any type of candle or naked flame on the top of or near the unit.

Moisture

- To reduce the risk of fire, electric shock or product damage, do not expose this unit to rain, moisture, dripping or splashing. No objects filled with liquids, should be placed on the unit.
- If you spill any liquid into the unit, it can cause serious damages. Switch it off at the mains immediately. Withdraw the mains plug and consult your dealer.

Ventilation

- To prevent the risk of electric shock or fire hazard due to overheating, ensure that curtains and other materials do not obstruct the ventilation vents.
- Do not install or place this unit in a bookcase, built-in cabinet or in another confined space. Ensure the unit is well ventilated.

Safety

- Always disconnect the unit from the mains supply before connecting/disconnecting other devices or moving the unit.
- Unplug the unit from the mains socket before a lightning storm.

Mains Cable

- Make sure the unit or the unit stand is not resting on top of the mains cable, as the weight of the unit may damage the cable and create a safety hazard.

Interference

- Do not place the unit on or near appliances which may cause electromagnetic interference. If you do, it may adversely affect the operating performance of the unit, and cause a distorted picture or sound.

Safety warnings

Batteries

- Batteries used in the remote control for this unit are easily swallowed by young children and this is dangerous.
- Keep loose batteries away from young children and make sure that the battery holder tray is secure in the remote control. Seek medical advice if you believe a cell has been swallowed.
- Dispose of batteries correctly by following the guidance in this manual.

Supervision

- Children should be supervised to ensure that they do not play with the unit and the remote control.
- Never let anyone especially children push anything into the holes, slots or any other openings in the case -this could result in a fatal electric shock.

Service

- To reduce the risk of electric shock, do not remove screws. The unit does not contain any user-serviceable parts. Leave all maintenance work to qualified personnel.
- Do not open any fixed covers as this may expose dangerous voltages.

Maintenance

- Ensure the unit is fully unplugged from the power supply before cleaning.
- Do not use any type of abrasive pad or abrasive cleaning solutions as these may damage the unit's surface.
- Do not use liquids to clean the unit.



Warning! To reduce the risk of fire or electrical shock, do not expose this TV to rain or moisture. The TV must not be exposed to dripping and splashing and no objects filled with liquids such as a vase of flowers should be placed on the TV.



Caution! Changes or modifications not expressly approved by the manufacturer could void the user's warranty.

Caution! Usage of controls or adjustments or performance of procedures other than those specified herein may result in hazardous exposure.

The power cord on this equipment is supplied with a moulded plug incorporating a fuse. Should the fuse need to be replaced, an ASTA or BSI approved BSI 362 fuse must be used of the same rating. Never use the plug with the fuse cover removed. If a replacement fuse cover is required, ensure it is of the same colour as that visible on the pin face of the plug. If there is no alternative to cutting off the mains plug, dispose of it immediately, having first removed the fuse, to avoid a possible shock hazard by inadvertent connection to the mains supply.



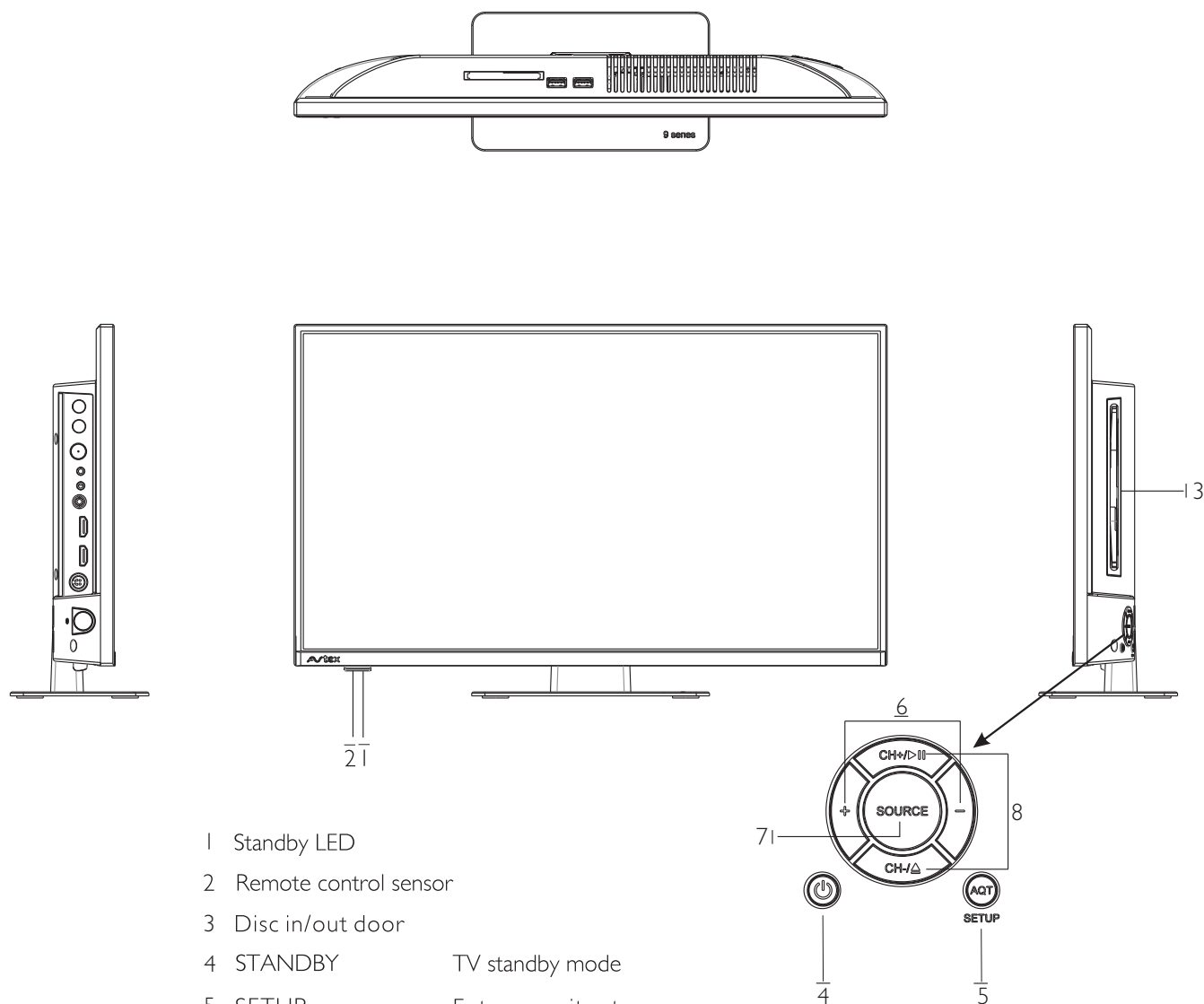

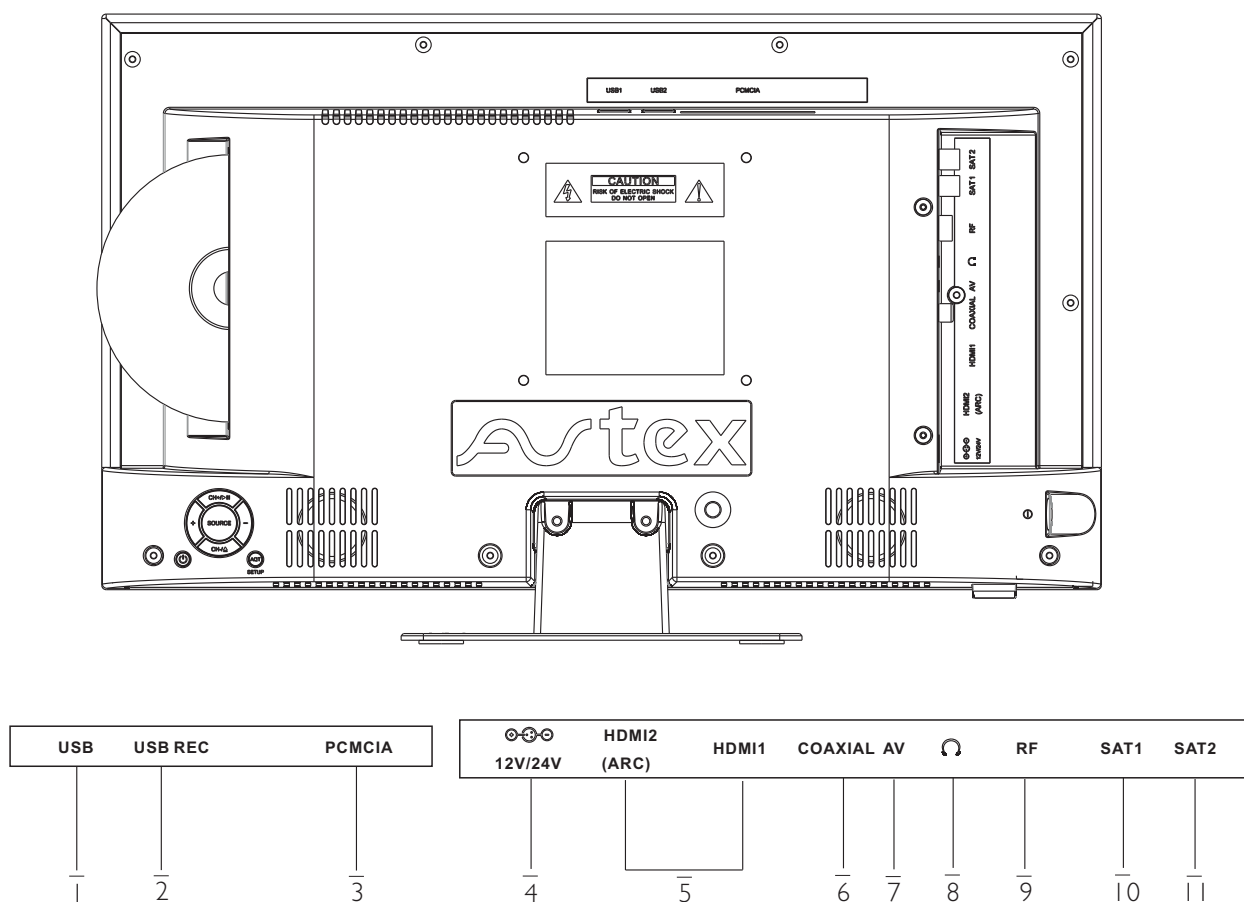

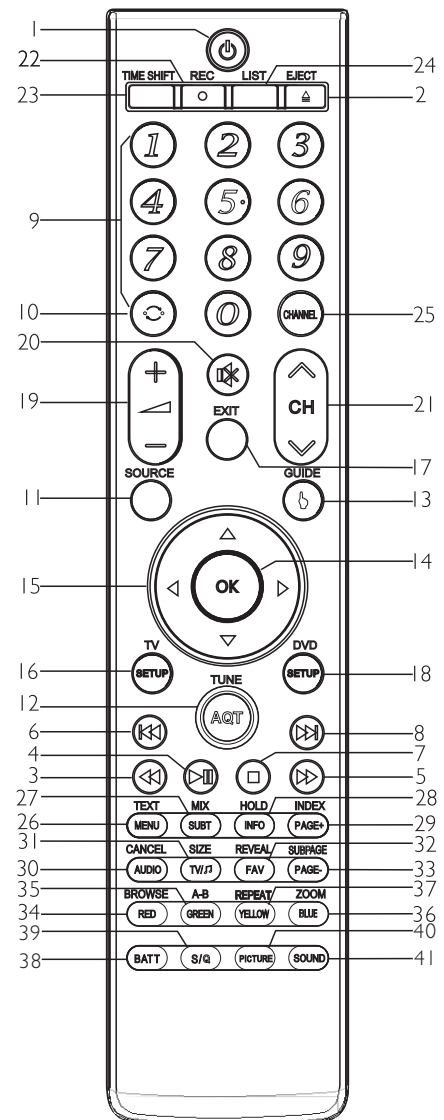

Parts identification

Remote control

When using the remote control, aim it towards the remote control sensor on the TV. The function of some buttons will vary depending on the source being used digital TV(DTV)),

1. Standby Switches the TV to standby.
2. EJECT Disc in/out in DVD
3. ◀◀ button To fast backward playback in DVD and USB.
4. ▶▶ button To play normally or pause playing in DVD and USB.
5. ▶▶ button To fast-forwards playback in DVD and USB.
6. ◀◀ button To select the previous chapter or track in DVD and USB.
7. ■ button To stop playing in DVD and USB.
8. ▶▶ button To select the next chapter or track in DVD and USB.
9. Numeric buttons
10. Return ↶ Returns back to previous programme
11. Source Input source selector
12. Tune/AQT Press and hold (more than 3 seconds) the button to start autoscanning in DTV.
13. Guide/Q-PLAY To display the program guide in DTV/SAT; Play DVD directly in DVD.
14. OK button Confirms a selection
15. ▲▼◀▶ Adjusts selected item in the menu
16. TV SETUP To display system menu Except DVD
17. Exit Exits out of a menu
18. DVD SETUP Enter or exit setup menu for DVD
19. Volume +/- Increases and decreases volume level
20. Mute Mutes the sound
21. Channel ◀ Changes the TV channel
22. REC To start recording DTV/SAT program; To hide recording Dialog.

30. CANCEL/AUDIO To cancel teletext in AV; To change the audio language and sound track in DTV / SAT / DVD.
31. Size/TV/r To magnify teletext page; Switches between TV and Radio mode in DTV / SAT.
32. Reveal/Fav To display the hidden teletext information in AV; To display Favourite list in DTV.
33. Subpage/Page - Displays sub pages when in teletext in AV; Browse the previous page of channel edit/list table in DTV / SAT.



34. BROWSE/RED Press to turn on/off the browser function in DVD; Teletext RED button in DTV / SAT.
35. A-B/GREEN To segment repeat in DVD and USB; Teletext Green button in DTV / SAT.
36. ZOOM/BLUE To zoom in or zoom out the picture in DVD and USB; Teletext BLUE button in DTV / SAT.
37. REPEAT/YELLOW To repeat playback in DVD and USB; Teletext YELLOW button in DTV / SAT.
38. BATT To display TV supply voltage.
39. S/Q To display signal strength and quality.
40. PICTURE To change picture mode.
41. SOUND To change sound mode.

Connecting the TV

Connecting the aerial



Warning! Make sure the TV and all ancillary equipment are unplugged from the mains before making any connections

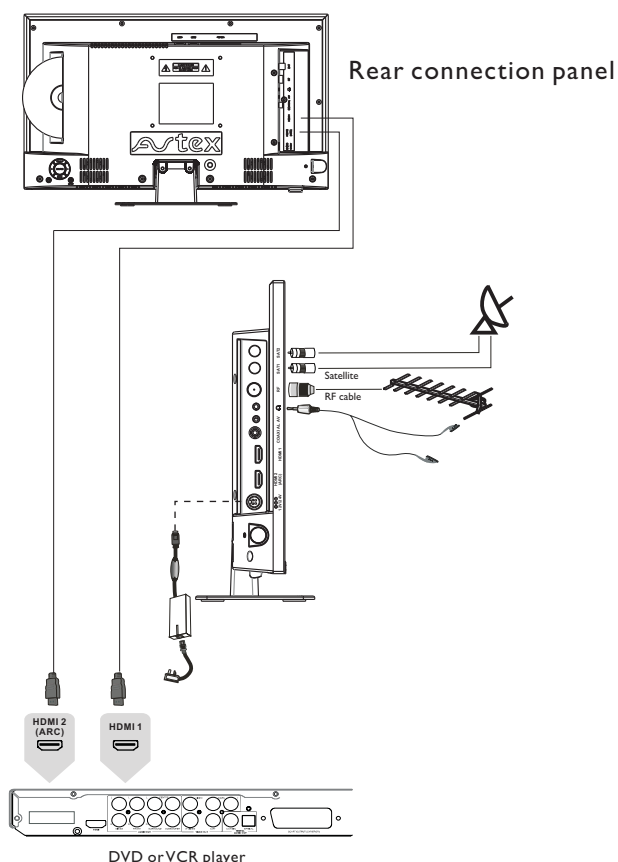
Place the TV on a stable flat surface, which is out of direct sunlight and away from any heat sources. In order to prevent TV picture distortion, make sure you avoid close proximity to other electrical devices such as microwave ovens.

Connect the aerial cable to the Back(RF in) of the TV.

Connect satellite cable to the SAT 1 socket for watching and record, and SAT2 socket for record.

To connect it directly through a recording device (DVD recorder), connect the TV/DVD as shown below. For best results use a high gain TV aerial, preferably roof or loft mounted.

- To watch and record different satellite programmes a separate signal needs to be applied to both Sat 1 and Sat 2 inputs. If only one satellite signal available this MUST be applied to Sat 1 input. It will still be possible to record one satellite channel and watch another source simultaneously
- If in a poor signal area, to improve picture quality, purchase and install a signal amplifier (not supplied).



Connecting external devices

The Quick Start guide shows the simplest and most effective way of connecting to external devices. These and alternate methods are listed below.

HDMI lead

You can connect the TV to a compatible device using a HDMI lead, using this method will give you optimum picture.

Connect the cable from the HDMI equipment to one of the TV HDMI sockets.

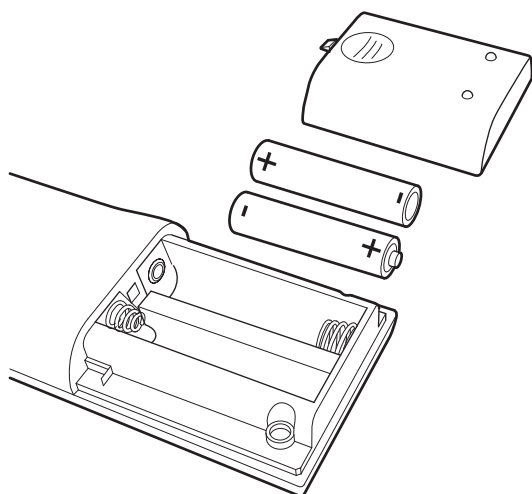
The HDMI2 will support the ARC function, so it is possible to connect the TV to an audio device that also has ARC capabilities. Please activate this function in the TV setup menu by setting the CEC and ARC settings to ON, allowing the standard supplied TV remote control to control the audio device volume and standby conditions.

Remote control

Remote control

Installing the batteries

1. The battery compartment cover is on the back of the remote control. Slide the cover to open it.
2. Install the two AAA size batteries following the polarity markings inside the compartment.
3. Replace the battery compartment cover.



Using the remote control

To use the remote control point it at the TV and press the required buttons. You must be within 6 metres and at an angle of less than 30 degrees from the centre of the TV.

Note: Sunshine or other strong light sources may interfere with the signal from the remote control. In this situation, turn the TV set away from the light source.



Warning! Do not leave batteries in the remote control for extended periods as they can leak or corrode causing damage to the remote control. Check them periodically and replace them as required.



Warning! Do not mix battery types. When inserting batteries, replace all batteries at the same time. Do not mix old and new batteries.



Warning! Exhausted batteries must be treated with care and disposed of according to any safety or recycling regulations in force in your local area. Never dispose of batteries into general waste, or fire.

Operating the TV

Switching on

Note: Unless otherwise stated, all references to buttons refer to the remote control.

1. Press the **power** switch on the left hand side of the TV
2. Press the **Standby** button on the remote control. The standby indicator will change to blue.

Switching off

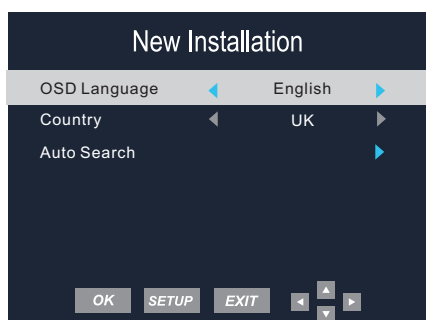
To switch the TV to standby press the **Standby** button on the remote control. The standby indicator will change to red.

To save energy do not leave the TV in standby mode for long periods such as overnight. Switch the TV off using the **Power** switch on the side of the TV.

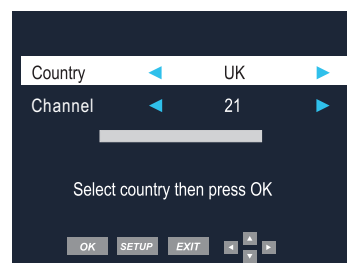
Tuning in digital TV

When the TV is switched On for the first time, the following screen will appear, press the **▲▼◀▶** buttons to select your On Screen Display (OSD) language. Select Auto Search and press the **OK** button.

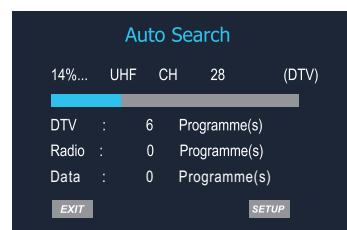
Note: You will not be able to select the country mode.



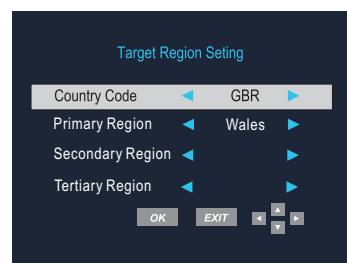
When this screen appears press the **▼** or **▲** buttons to select item, press **◀** or **▶** buttons to select country or channel. Press the **OK** button to confirm the selection. The auto tune will start and must not be interrupted once started.



When this screen appears, wait for the TV to tune your digital channels. This may take a few minutes,



Once the auto search is completed, the TV will display the target region setting. If more than one regional transmitter is available use **◀▶** to select your primary preference, then press **OK**, to leave this menu press EXIT.



Please wait for channels to populate the list, there may be a small delay as all channels are correctly allocated.

For your information HD channels are populated in the list from channel 101 onwards.

Once the target region setting or Auto search is completed, the TV will display the first available digital channel. All other available digital channels will be displayed in the Channel List by pressing the **CHANNEL** button. For more information, please refer to other sections of the User guide.



To retune the TV at any time, press and hold down the **Auto tune** button(AQT). Select the country you require and press **OK**. The auto tune will start.

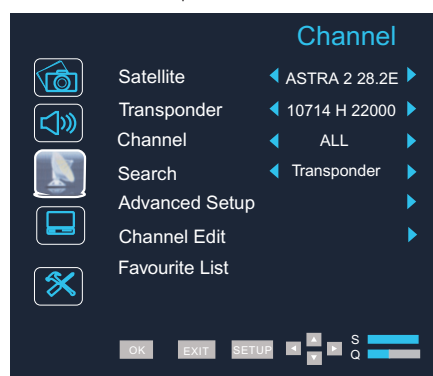
Operating the TV

Tuning in satellite TV

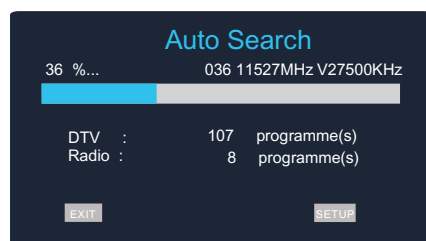
For convenience your I 99/219/249DRS-PRO comes with a default channel list from first switch on, you are able to edit and sort this list to your own personal preference. If any further channels are required then you must start a full scan.

To perform a full scan

Press TV SETUP and select "Channel", press **OK** or **▶**
Select the wanted satellite(default is Astra 28.2)
Confirm there is signal in the indicator
Scroll down and select " Search Transponder", press **OK**
This will then start a complete scan of the selected satellite



A scan will locate all new services on the selected satellite and add after the default channel list.



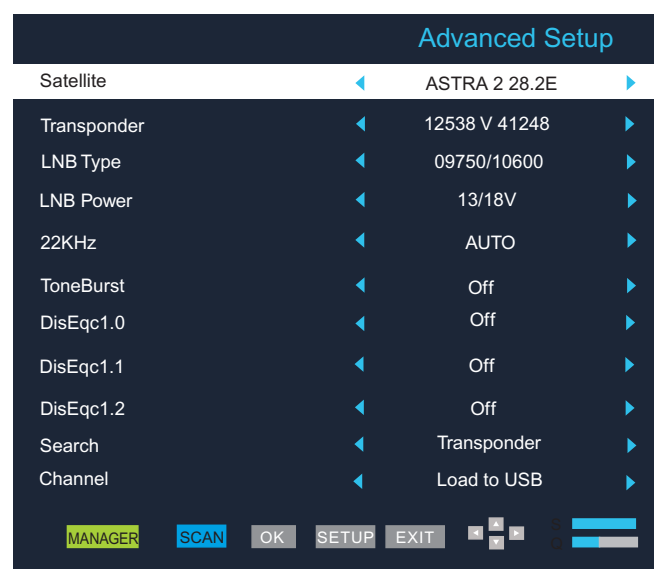
Any new/wanted channels can now be edited/sorted to the users desired preference, please refer to page 21 for channel edit feature.

Advanced Setup

By default your satellite TV will automatically scan all Free To Air or all Scramble channels on the satellite you have chosen in the Channel menu. There is however an opportunity to modify any of these auto settings in the Advanced Setup menu.

It is advised not to change any default setting unless advised by qualified personnel.

To enter Advanced Setup you will need to input password (default 0000).



Load to/from USB (Satellite only)

At any time, it is possible to download any of the alterations made to the channel list or favourite lists. Insert a USB memory device into USB1 of the TV and enter advanced menu. Select Channel and using cursor keys set to "Load to USB" press **OK**. This will download the current satellite channel settings to the memory device, and if needed in the future can be used to upload back into the TV by changing the setting to Load from USB.

Setting Favourites (Satellite Only)

Press TV SETUP and select "Channel", using the cursor keys select Favourite List and press **OK**. It is now possible to set up to 5 Favourite lists. Press the FAV button to select the list and then add the wanted programmes using the **RED** button. To delete any programmes from the favourite list, use the cursor keys to highlight and press **YELLOW** to delete.

To select your favourite list whilst viewing press the FAV button and use the cursor keys to browse through the lists.

When selecting a programme to watch either use the cursor keys and select OK, or enter the channel number to view, (needs to be a 3-digit entry i.e. Channel 3 will be entered as 003).

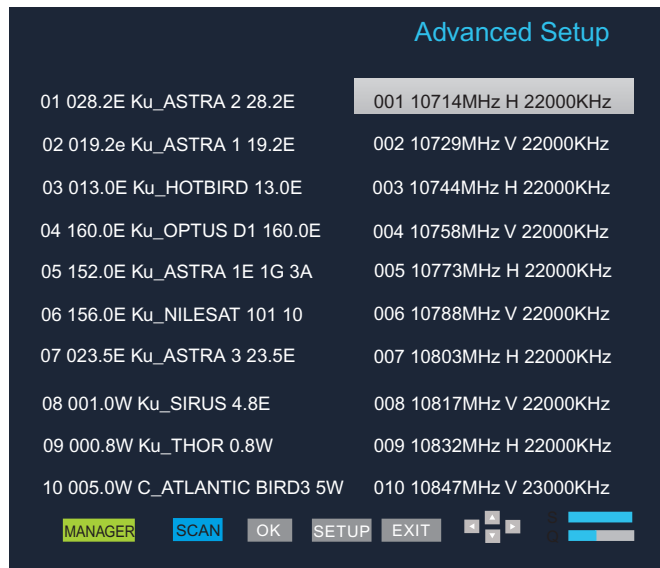
To Add New Services/Channels

Due to broadcast changes and to future proof your Satellite TV it is possible to add additional transponders so you have the opportunity to add any new channels that may get added to the channel list.

To add a transponder follow the procedure below:

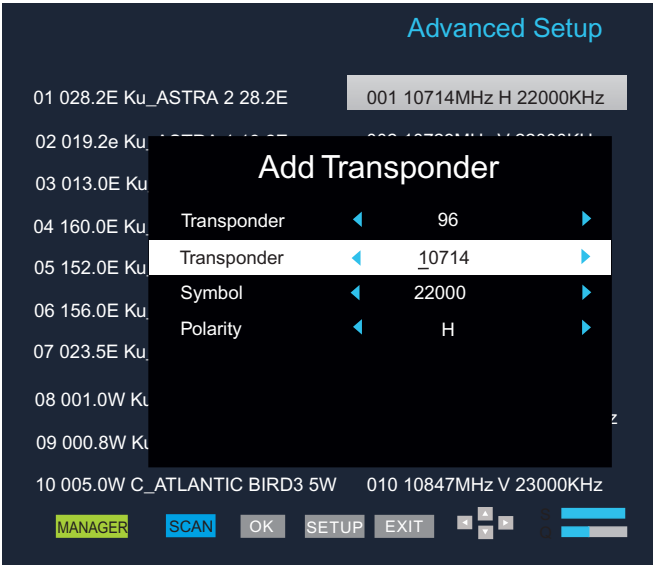
Access Advanced Setup menu, you will need to input password (default 0000)

Press the GREEN button to enter satellite and TP Manager
Select the satellite you are tuned to (default Astra 28.2), and press the ► button enter TP list.

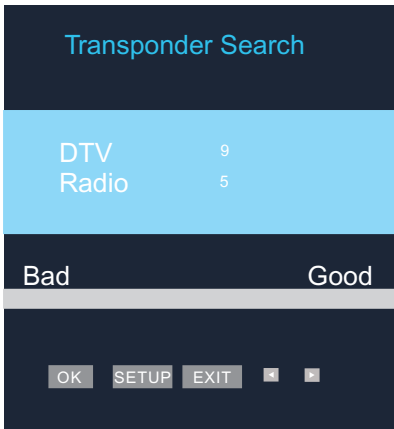


Press RED button Add the new frequency. Symbol rate and polarity.

Press OK to store.



Press BLUE scanning button, your Satellite TV will then automatically scan the new transponder and add any new channels found and add them to you channel list.



Frequently Asked Questions

For satellite setup

1) No channels found, signal and quality bars are zero?

Please check satellite dish/LNB setup, also all cables are in position correctly. Confirm there is a clear line of sight to where the dish is pointing with no obstructions, i.e. trees, buildings etc. Ensure your location is within the footprint of the desired satellite transponder.

2) Full scan performed but limited or incorrect channels are received?

Ensure the dish is aligned with selected satellite correctly, e.g.. Astra 28.2

3) Picture or sound is breaking up or dropping out whilst viewing?

Confirm signal quality, enter Channel Search menu and check strength and quality bars. A slight misalignment could cause a large reduction in signal strength. Also confirm cable quality for satellite reception and cable length. A long cable run could incur significant signal loss (this can be compensated with a signal amplifier/booster). Ensure dish is correct size to receive wanted signal.

4) Loss of signal in light rain or snow

Usually due to signal strength, please confirm all items above

5) Loss of signal in windy conditions

Confirm all dish and mountings are secure and are not moving in the wind. Check there are no obstacles such as trees moving back and forth in front of dish.

6) Subtitles or audio language are incorrect

Confirm preferred settings in language settings

7) How do I add additional channels not in original line up?

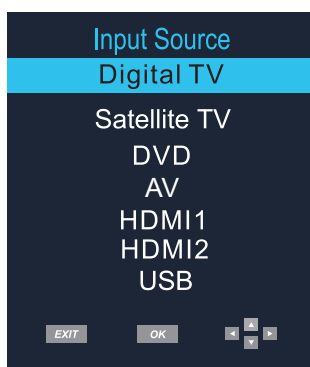
You will need to add additional transponder, please follow detailed instruction in the manual.

Operating the TV

Basic operation

Source selection

Press the **Source** button to display the source menu. The following sources are available:



Use the **▲▼** buttons to scroll between inputs and press **OK** to select the source.

If no source is manually selected using the **OK** button, the TV will automatically switch to the highlighted input after 15 seconds.

Press the **Exit** button to exit the display.

TV channel selection

Press the **CH \wedge /CH \vee** buttons or use the **Numeric** buttons on the remote control to select a channel you require.

Return

Press the **↺** button to swap between the channel you are watching and the previously selected channel i.e. If you were watching channel 1 and change to channel 3, press the **↺** button to return to channel 1.

Press the **↺** button again to return to channel 3.

Volume

Press the **V+ / V-** buttons to increase or decrease the volume. The volume level will be displayed at the bottom of the screen.

Mute

Press the **🔇** button to mute the sound. Mute will appear at the top right hand side of the screen.

Press the **🔇** button again or the **V+** button to restore the sound. Mute will disappear from the screen.

Operating the TV

Favourite(Digital TV only)

You can enter the Favourite menu while watching a channel by pressing the **Fav** button. The following menu will appear on the screen:

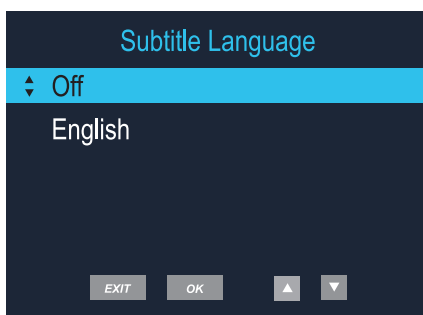


To add a channel to the Favourite List, press the **TV SETUP** button and scroll down to the Channel Setup. Press the **▶** button to access the menu. Press the **▼** button to select Channel Edit then press **OK**.

In the Channel Edit menu is a list of all available channels. Select the channel that you want to add to the Favourite List. Press the **Fav** button to add the selected channel. A heart will appear next to the selected channel. Press the **Exit** button to exit the menu.

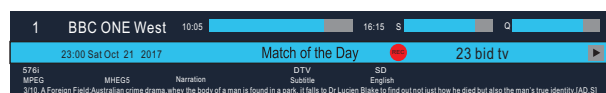
Subtitle

If a channel has subtitles available, you can select the subtitles by pressing the **Subt** button. Select the required language using the **▲▼** buttons then press **OK**.



Information

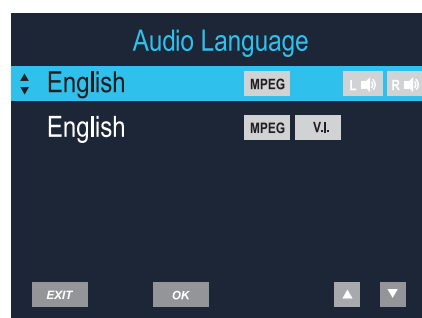
You can view the programme information for the channel you are watching by pressing the **Info** button. The following menu is a typical example of the programme details that will be displayed.



You can view the information for the next programme by pressing the **▶** button.

Audio

- In Digital mode press the **Audio** button to change the audio language and sound track. The following menu will be displayed.



- Select the required audio language using the **▲▼** buttons then press **OK**.
- Audio language option is dependent on broadcast.

TV/🎵

Press the **TV/🎵** button to switch between Digital TV and Digital radio modes.

Operating the TV

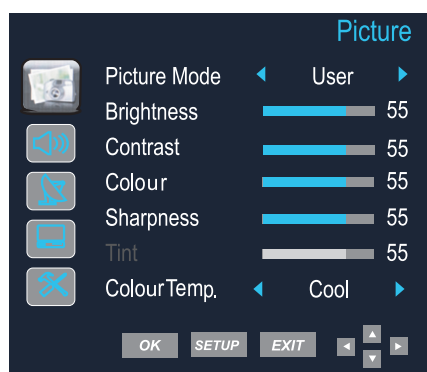
Menus

The setup menus allow you to adjust and control the TV.

1. To access the on screen menus, press the **TV SETUP** button.
2. Press the **▲▼◀▶** buttons to navigate around the menu screens and available options.
3. To exit the setup menu press the **Exit** or **TV SETUP** button.

Picture settings

This menu gives the options for adjusting the appearance of the TV picture. The following options are available:



Picture Mode – Allows you to select preset levels of contrast, brightness and colour. You can choose from the following settings:

- User
- Standard
- Dynamic
- Soft

Brightness – Allows you to increase or decrease the brightness of the picture.

Contrast – Allows you to increase or decrease the contrast of the picture.

Colour – Allows you to increase or decrease the colour of the picture.

Sharpness – Allows you to increase or decrease the sharpness of the picture.

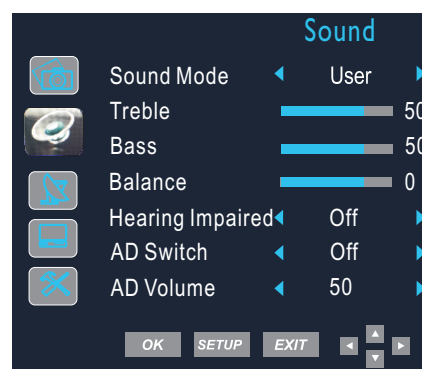
Tint – Allows you to increase or decrease the level of tint of the picture (only NTSC signal)

Colour Temperature – Allows you to change the colour tones of the screen. You can choose from the following settings:

- Normal
- Warm
- Cool

Sound settings

This menu gives you the options for adjusting the TV sound. The following options are available:



Sound Mode – Allows you to select preset levels of bass and treble. You can choose from the following settings:

- User
- Standard
- Music
- Film
- News

Treble – Allows you to adjust the treble level.

Bass – Allows you to adjust the bass level.

Balance – Allows you adjust the audio output between the left speaker and the right speaker.

Hearing Impaired – Allows you to turn on/off hearing impaired (only available in DTV). Hearing Impaired option is dependent on broadcast.

Operating the TV

AD Switch - Allows you to turn on/off AD Switch.

(only available in DTV).

AD Volume - Allows you to adjust AD Volume.

Channel Setup(Digital TV only)

This menu allows you to adjust the channels and the channel settings.

Channel – Allows you to select the channel you want to adjust.

Frequency – Not able to be adjusted.

Country – Not able to be adjusted.
